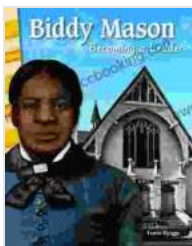


Biddy Mason: Becoming a Leader | Primary Source Readers

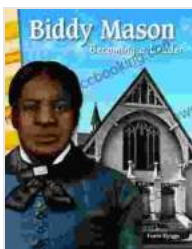
