6. **Round 12:** Ch 1, sc in the first 18 stitches. *Inc, sc in the next 2 stitches.* Repeat from * to * around. Sl st to join. (54 sc)
7. **Round 13-16:** Ch 1, sc in each stitch around. Sl st to join. (54 sc each round)
8. **Round 17:** Ch 1, sc in the first stitch. *Dec, sc in the next 5 stitches.* Repeat from * to * around. Sl st to join. (42 sc)
9. **Round 18-20:** Ch 1, sc in each stitch around. Sl st to join. (42 sc each round)
10. **Round 21:** Ch 1, hdc in each stitch around. Sl st to join. (42 hdc)

11. **Round 22-23:** Ch 1, dc in each stitch around. Sl st to join. (42 dc each round)
12. **Round 24:** Ch 1, sc in each stitch around. Sl st to join. (42 sc)
13. **Round 25:** Ch 1, sl st in each stitch around. Fasten off and weave in ends.

Finishing Touches

Once you've crocheted the main part of the sneakers, it's time for some finishing touches:

- **Laces:** You can add laces by threading a yarn needle through a few stitches along the sides of the shoe.
- **Velcro closure:** For easy on and off, sew a small piece of Velcro to the inside of the sneakers.

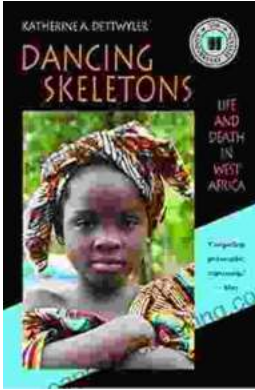


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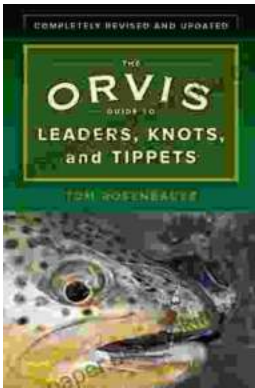
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
