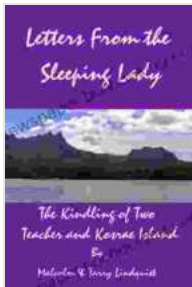


Letters From The Sleeping Lady: The Kindling Of Two Teachers And Kosrae Island
