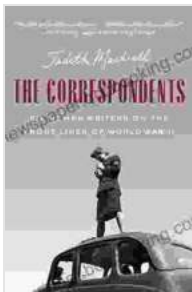

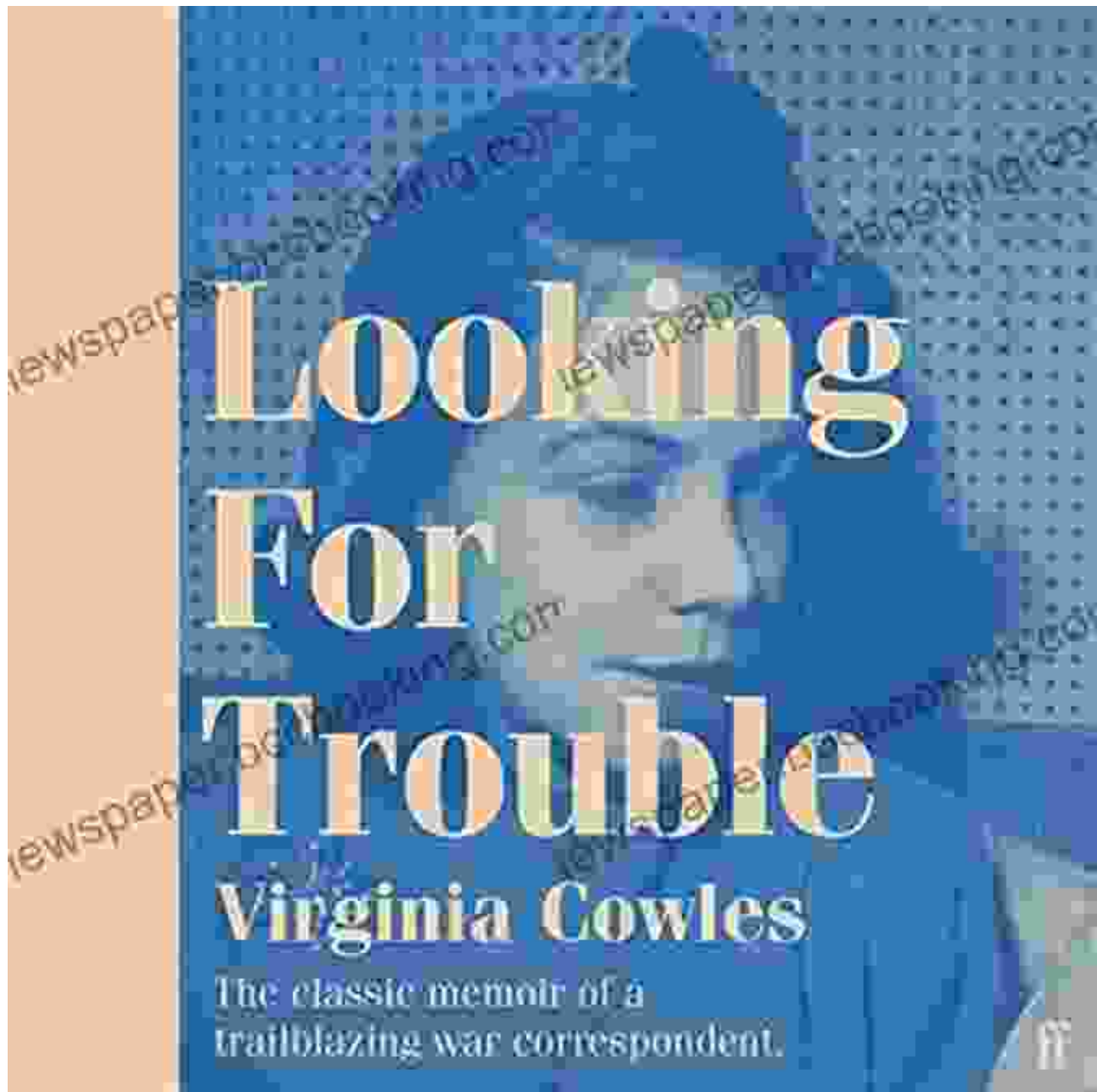

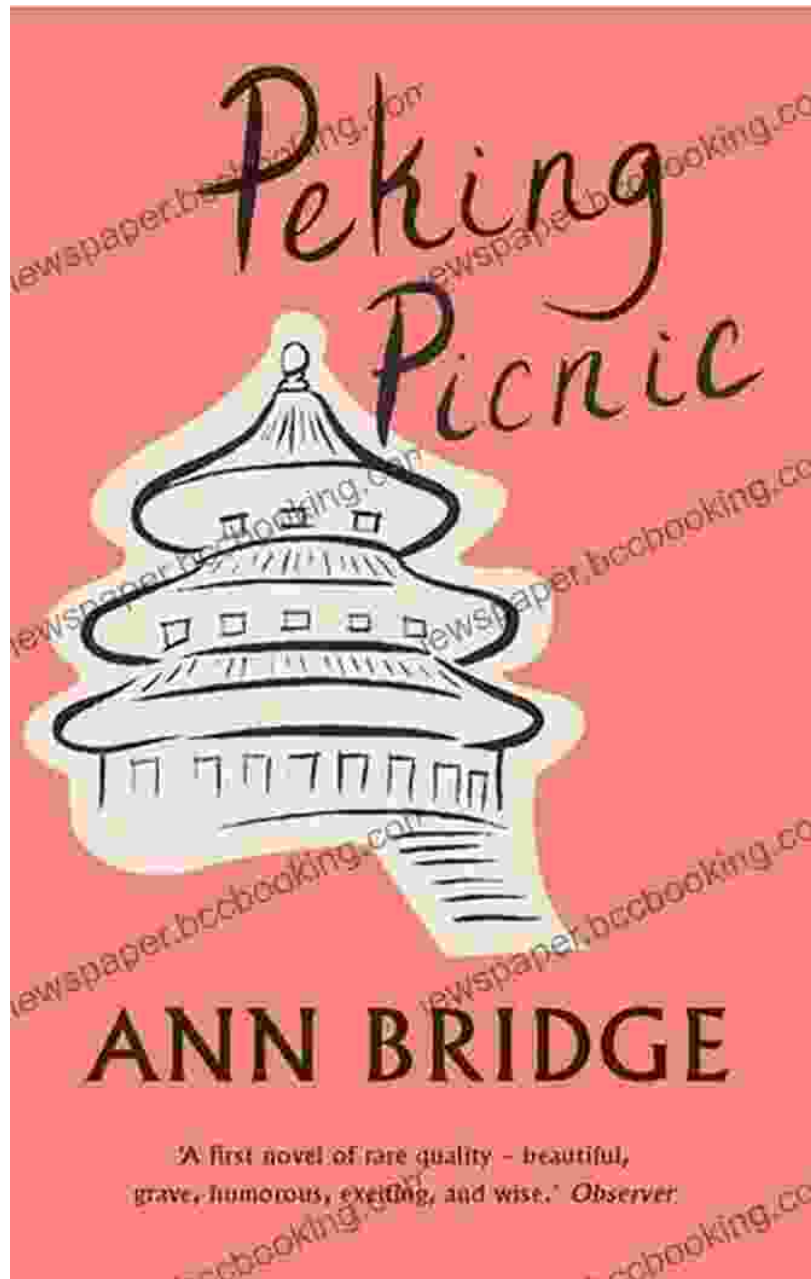

Lee Miller



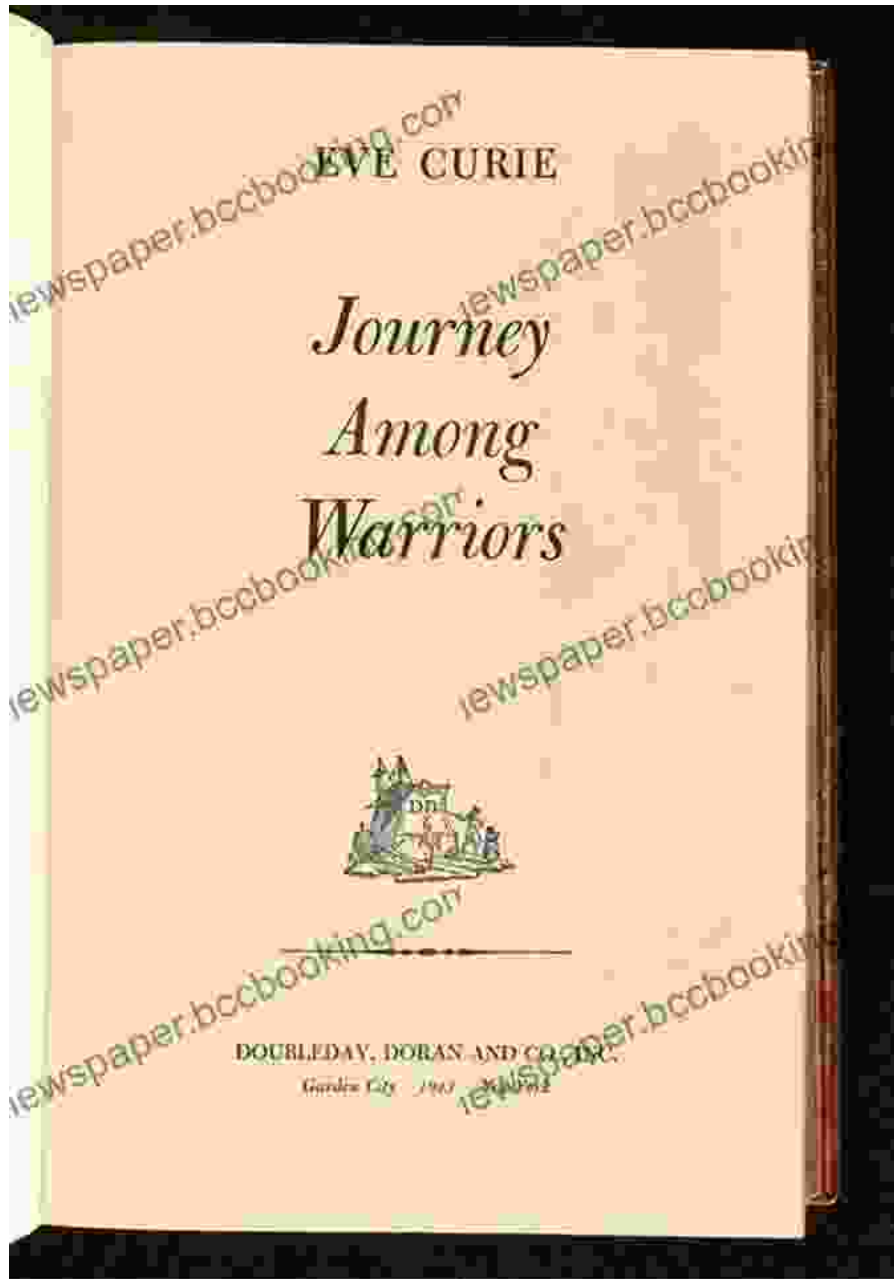
